

Typical classes 10th grade students take (Class of 2023):

- English 10, English HONORS, Humanities 10 HONORS (Eng 10 H & AP Euro)
- World History 10, AP European History, Humanities 10 HONORS (Eng 10 H & AP Euro)
- Earth & Space Science, Physical Science, Chemistry, (or Bio if failed it grade 9)
- Math:, Geometry, Geometry HONORS, Algebra 2, Algebra 2 HONORS (Algebra 1 if failed in grade 9)
- Elective: (consider World lang, PE, Art, CTE) *(at least 2 years of world lang reqd for 4 year college)*

Typical classes 11th grade students take (Class of 2022):

- English 11, AP English 11, Humanities 11 (Eng 11 & US/WA State History)
- US/WA State History, AP US/WA State History, Humanities 11 (Eng 11 & US/WA State History)
- Earth & Space Science, Physical Science, Chemistry, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, Physics, AP Biology, Human Anatomy & Physiology, Zoology, Astronomy
- Math: Geometry, Geometry HONORS, Algebra 2, Algebra 2 HONORS, Pre-Calculus, Pre-Calculus HONORS, Calculus, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics

Typical classes 12th grade students take (Class of 2021):

- English 12, AP English 12, Literature of Social Justice, Humanities 12 (English 12 & Senior SS)
- Civics/Econ/Contemporary World Problems, Ethnic Studies, AP American Government, Humanities 12 (English 12 & Senior SS) Note- AP Psych does not count for junior or senior history. It may be used to fulfill a failed 9th, 10th, or 12th grade history class but only if the typical class was taken and failed.

 - Financial Algebra is a 3rd credit of math option for kids struggling to pass alg 2 and it can also count for personal finance. It can also counts towards meeting the math state standard.

- College bound seniors should have a math based class in their senior year (required for 4 year unless they completed pre-calc as a junior).
